

- Fortunately, many stones can be uncovered and rescued.

Highlights of Rogers Family History

- John Rogers and his wife, Elizabeth (Spencer) emigrated to Nova Scotia from Ireland in 1761
- The Rogers settled in Londonderry Township NS in the area now known as Great Village.
- John Rogers Jr. was supposedly the first male born in Londonderry. Robert Rogers was born shortly thereafter.
- These two sons married daughters of John Mahon Esq. John married Eleanor. Robert married Martha.
- John Dudgeon, a boat builder, married Betsey Mahon, another daughter of John Mahon

Rogers History Continued

- About 1801 John Dudgeon, John & Robert Rogers sailed to the Shepody Area near Hopewell, Westmorland (now Albert County) NB
- The three brothers-in-law settled next to each other on the Prince's Grant.
- Eventually some of John Dudgeon's land became Shepody Cemetery overlooking Shepody Bay.
- Many Rogers descendants are buried in Shepody Cemetery, which is next to Robert Rogers' former land.

John Dudgeon came To Hopewell in 1801 with The two Rogers' brothers John and Robert Rogers.



Robert Rogers Died Feb 1840 Age 74 years Son of John Rogers; Husband of Martha Mahon



Robert Rogers' Estate was probated in 1839 so he died in Feb. 1839, not 1840. Provincial Archives of New Brunswick (PANB.)

William Rogers died 29 July 1860 Age 69 Son of Robert Rogers and Martha Mahon




